Improve youth mental health care in Canada through transforming care and research

- 1** Opening integrated youth mental health service sites across Canada that provide quick access to services iwithin 72 hours.
- 2** Working with youth, families and carers, service providers, and researchers from coast to coast to coast, our network has designed and put in place an evaluation toolkit to ensure that youth receive the right care, at the right time, in the right place – and on their terms.
- 3** Helping service providers, managers, and clinical leaders across Canada optimize their services through transformation of services, integration of evaluation into care and engagement of youth, families and carers.

The ACCESS Open Minds network is made up of 300+ youth, families and carers, service providers, researchers, and policy makers from across Canada, all working together to transform youth mental health care. At ACCESS OM sites, youth in need are able to get help that is based on their own goals and needs, where and when they want it. Common research and evaluation tools are used by all ACCESS OM sites to support evidence-informed practice, and will pave the way for all Canadian youth to be able to receive mental health care appropriate to their needs and situation.
